#### I. Item for Approval

#### Proposed Policy for Terms of Service on Classis GLA Ministry

- 1. Persons will be approved by Classis for 3-year terms.
- 2. Teams will see to it that the terms of their members are staggered.
- 3. Persons willing to serve additional terms will be endorsed by their team and approved by Classis.
- 4. When a chairpersons or secretaries enter their final year of service, they will mentor their replacement during that year.
- 5. Administrative process:
  - a. Each year in January, the stated clerk will provide the chair of each team with a list of team member which shows the year of their 3 year term each members is in.
  - b. The chair will distribute this list to the team for its first meeting of the calendar year.
  - c. If new team members will be needed by January of the following year, the team will inform Classis of this—preferably at its February meeting and no later than its May meeting.
  - d. New team members will be presented for Classis approval at its October Meeting.

#### Grounds

- 1. Persons will be clear about the length of a ministry team commitment, may feel freer to explore other service options, and may have more varied service opportunities.
- 2. Classis will be more aware of whom is serving where, have increased confidence that leaders of teams are prepared for their tasks, have added opportunity to suggest or solicit ministry team members, and may benefit from the addition of team members with new ideas and the subtraction of team members serving without energy because they feel stuck.
- \* This policy does not apply to staff members of ministry teams, since serving on teams relevant to their area of service is part of their job.

Michael A. Mata has designed and administered community and faith-based programs for over 30 years, particularly in the areas of community development, congregational redevelopment, intercultural programs, organizational and leadership development, ministry/nonprofit management and community youth development. He directs the Graduate Los Angeles Program in Transformational Urban Leadership at Azusa Pacific Seminary and is the Community Transformation Specialist with Compassion Creates Change, Inc.. Prior to his current assignments he was the Urban Development Director for World Vision U.S. Program where he was responsible for guiding the department's implementation of its Signature Programs Model (community transformation focused on community youth development). Mata was the Mildred M. Hutchinson Assistant Professor of Urban Ministry (the first endowed chair in urban ministry) and Director of the Urban Leadership Institute at the Claremont School of Theology.

  - 3. Encourage and, if necessary, empower with financial support, individual churches or church partnerships in Classis GLA to organize, host and invite the churches of Classis to local training seminars, workshops and other leadership development events that meet local church needs. Examples: Small group leader training, elder/deacon training, safe church training, evangelism and outreach, youth leader training, etc. Such training opportunities will be promoted at GLA Classis meetings, through emails, the monthly newsletter, and visits by the Classis mission leaders.
  - 4. **Timothy Leadership Training Institute A)** Communicate to all the GLA churches the nature, value, opportunities, and requirements of becoming a "Master Trainer" of the Timothy Leadership Training modules at our February Classis meeting. **B)** Organize, promote and invite all the leaders in Classis GLA and California South to the LA based Timothy Leadership Training Institutes to be held in March and October, hosted by Ttokamsa Mission Church in partnership with the TLTI staff. These training sessions will be promoted using TLTI generated promotion materials, Classis newsletters, emails, and announcements at Classis meetings.

**Aaron Solomon-Mills** is originally from the Chicago area. He studied music at St. Xavier University of Chicago and then later received ministry training from the Christian Leaders Institute, an organization founded by members of the CRC. He then served as Associate Pastor and then later, Lead Pastor of Eagle Rock Community Church in Homer Glen, Illinois. He is being called to serve as a Commissioned Pastor by First Bellflower CRC. He is married and has six children.

**Enoch Jinsik Kim** was born in Korea and came to Christ as a teenager and sensed a call to evangelism and missions. He studied and worked as an engineer but then later served as a missionary among the Hui, an unreached Chinese Muslim people group. After 16 years of service he pursued further study at Fuller Theological Seminary and is now serving as a professor there in the Korean Studies Program. He has been part of All Nations CRC since 2002 and they are calling him to serve as an associate pastor while he continues his work at Fuller. He is married to Sarah and together they have three children.
